## Item No. 1.2: Ratification of Constitution of new Board of Studies for various departments of SBSSU.

As per the guidelines of UGC, the Board of Studies (BOSs) for various departments of the university were constituted for the period of three years. The newly constituted BOSs are placed at **Annexure – 1.** 

These compositions of Board of Studies are put up before the Academic Council for ratification and approval please.

#### Item No. 1.3: Approval for Academic Regulations of the University.

A committee was constituted vide office order no SBSSTC/FZR/4217-18 dated 29.11.2021 for preparing the Academic regulations for smooth functioning of the university.

In this regard the committee had a number of sittings with Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Dean Academics, all HODs and other key institute functionaries. The committee has prepared the detailed Academic Guidelines and Ordinances to be followed in the university. The skeleton of teaching schemes for B.Tech courses is also prepared (as per new education policy 2020) with multiple exit points after  $1^{st}$  year,  $2^{nd}$  year and  $3^{rd}$  year. These guidelines are places as **Annexure – 2a, 2b, 2c & 2d.** 

#### Item No. 1.4: Approval to introduce a new subject named Introduction to Shaheed Bhagat Singh and his Co-Patriots in the session 2022-23 onwards.

A new non-credit subject named 'Introduction to Shaheed Bhagat Singh and his Co-Patriots' with Course Code HU100C is to be introduced to all programs/courses of the university from session 2022-23 onwards. Every student need to pass this subject for obtaining his/her degree. The performance of the students will be evaluated as Satisfactory/Non-satisfactory on the basis of continuous internal evaluation.

In this regard a committee was constituted vide office order no. SBSSU/FZR/4742-43 dated 4.1.2022 for the purpose of formulating the syllabus and other guidelines related to this subject. The committee had taken the inputs from Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, Registrar, Dean Academics, all HODs and other outside experts as well. On the basis of this, the committee has prepared the detailed syllabus and list of books for this subject and are places as **Annexure – 3**.

## Item No. 1.5: Approval for the implementation of grading system to 2021 batch and onwards.

As per UGC Guidelines, the students must be awarded grades by implementing Choice Based Credit System. To achieve this, the following grading system is proposed to be implemented for 2021 batch onwards:

- 1. The relative grading system may be applied to the students of 2021 batch onwards.
- 2. The relative grading will be applicable if the number of eligible students (including regular and reappear candidates) is equal to or more than 30 in a given subject in a given session. If this number is less than 30, then absolute grading system may be applied.
- 3. The total marks obtained in a given subject will be converted to letter grade by using the equivalence table.
- 4. A candidate has to score 30% in the continuous evaluation and 35% in the end semester evaluation separately to pass a subject.
- 5. The candidate will earn grade F in case he/she fails in continuous evaluation and/ or end semester examination.
- 6. The relative grading will be based upon the statistical method i.e. mean and standard deviation.
- 7. Any student who scores less than 20% aggregate marks in a given subject will be excluded from the calculation of mean and standard deviation. All such students will be awarded F grade.
- 8. A student will be awarded a letter grade in each course he/she has registered for, indicating his/her overall performance in that course. There shall be ten letter grades: A+, A, B+, B, C, D, P, F, R and S/US.

- 9. A student getting F/ US grade in a course due to non-fulfillment of minimum percentage of marks requirement may appear for supplementary examination as per Academic Calendar provided the student has fulfilled the attendance requirement in that course.
- 10. "R" grade (Retained) is awarded if student is detained i.e., attendance in theory class/laboratory is less than 75% and the student will have to repeat the course as and when offered.
- 11. It is also compulsory to appear in the End Semester Examination.
- 12. A student who secures "F" grade will have an option to appear in End Semester Examination i.e. external component. His/her continuous assessment marks will be retained as per the last attempt. Moreover, he/she will also have the option to repeat the course by re-registering in that course, whenever it is offered next time.
- 13. The performance of the student may be measured in terms of two indices, namely SGPA (Semester Grade Point Average) and CGPA (Cumulative Grade Point Average).

The SGPA (Semester Grade Point Average) is an indicator of the overall academic performance of a student in all the courses he/she has registered during a given semester. For m number of courses registered in a semester, each having credit  $C_i$  and Grade academic performance  $G_i$ , the SGPA is given by

$$SGPA = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^{m} C_i G_i}{\sum_{i=1}^{m} C_i}$$

Similarly, the CGPA (Cumulative Grade Point Average) indicates the overall academic performance of a student in all the courses registered up to and including the latest completed semester/supplementary term. It is computed in the same manner as the SGPA, considering all the courses (say, n), and is given by  $\sum_{i=1}^{n} C_i G_i$ 

$$CGPA = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^{n} C_i \overline{C_i}}{\sum_{i=1}^{n} C_i}$$

- 14. SGPA and CGPA shall be calculated up to two decimal lace, after rounding off the third decimal to the nearest second place integer decimal i.e. 0.005 is to be increased to 0.01. CGPA should be computed after every semester.
- 15. The conversion of SGPA or CGPA to percentage will be carried out by multiplication of the respective SGPA or CGPA with a factor of 10.Percentage = SGPA/CGPA x 10
- 16. An honors degree will be conferred at CGPA of 8.0 or above provided student should not have obtained even a single "F", "US" or "R" in any course during whole duration of the course.
- 17. The maximum period for completing the degree is 2N where N is the number of years specified in the study scheme.
- 18.*Improvement of Grade/ CGPA:* A student can apply for improvement in CGPA by improving the grade of any theory course. He/she will be allowed to appear only in End Semester Examination. In any case grade of other students of his/her original class shall not change. The student can improve at the most, in five subjects and maximum time allowed for this improvement will be within two years of completing the degree requirements, subject to fulfilling other conditions.
- 19. The proposed relative grading system is given in the table below

#### Item No. 1.6: Regarding the moderation of mid semester examination marks for 2021 batch students onwards.

It is proposed that the mid semester evaluation marks may be moderated by the faculty members so that the average marks should be within 65% to 75%.

# Item No. 1.7: Approval for awarding of grace marks to the students of 2021 batch and onwards.

As per the proposed grading system for 2021 batch onwards (item no. 1.5), a candidate must obtain 35% marks in end semester evaluation for being eligible for clearing a given course. It is proposed that the students may be allowed grace marks (upto 1% of the end semester theory examination subjects of a given semester in a given session) to clear the end semester theory examination. These marks may be distributed at the most into two theory subjects.

## Item No. 1.8: Approval for awarding of grace marks to clear the degree requirements to the students of 2021 batch and onwards.

As per the proposed grading system for 2021 batch onwards (item no. 1.5), a candidate must obtain 35% marks in end semester evaluation for being eligible for clearing a give course. At the end of the prescribed maximum duration for completing the course, there may be case where a candidate has cleared all courses except for one theory course in which he/she has failed. For such cases, the following mechanism is proposed for clearing the degree:

- 1. The candidate should move an application and pay a fee of Rs. 5000/-.
- 2. The candidate may be declared pass with "P" grade in that particular subject, if:
  - *i*. The sum total marks of the mid semester evaluation and the end semester evaluation obtained in that subject are at least 35%.
  - *ii*. The sum total marks obtained in that subject are less than 35%, then he/she may be awarded grace marks to clear the degree. These grace marks will be limited upto 4% marks of maximum marks of that subject to reach the threshold of 35% marks.

## Item No. 1.9: Approval for remuneration of examination related activities to external faculty.

The university has to engage faculty members/experts from outside the university for various examination related activities like question papers setting and evaluation work etc. For such cases, the following are the proposed rates of remuneration:

### Item No. 1.10: Ratification of remuneration of examination related activities to faculty engaged on lecture basis/ consolidated salary.

There are some faculty members engaged by the university on consolidated salary basis/lecture basis. Out of the faculty engaged on consolidated salary basis, some faculty has been relieved by the university. The examinations for November 2021 session were held in January 2022. For these examinations, some examination related activities like question papers setting, invigilation, evaluation work etc. were assigned to such faculty members. For such cases, with the approval of the competent authority, the concerned faculty members had been paid remuneration for various examination related activities as was being paid, at approved rates, in SBSSTC (Annexure - 4).

Further, it is proposed that from the session May 2022 onwards, the following rates of various examination related activities may be paid for such cases:

## Item No. 1.11: Approval of Committee for deciding Unfair Means Cases (UMC).

The university is conducting the examination from time to time. During examinations, some unfair means cases may be reported. For deciding such cases, the following committee is proposed:

1. A Retired Judge/Eminent Advocate	:	Chairman
2. Dean Academics	:	Member
3. Dean Student Welfare	:	Member
4. Registrar/Nominee	:	Member

Further, the Chairman may be paid honorarium @ Rs. 5000/per day in addition to TA/DA as applicable.

The tenure of this committee is proposed to be two years. The Chairman may be appointed in consultation with the district courts through legal cell.

#### Item No. 1.12: Ratification of change of credits of subject Power System Analysis and Design (BTEE-801A) for 2015 batch of SBSSTC.

The students of B. Tech. (Electrical Engg.) 8<sup>th</sup> semester were studying a subject Power System Analysis and Design (BTEE-801A). This subject carried 4 credits. In the result declared by the institute for May 2019 session, the credits of this subject were inadvertently mentioned as three (03). MRSPTU also declared the result with 3 credits for this subject.

Subsequently, as soon as the problem was identified, for 2016 batch onwards, the mistake in credits was rectified. Therefore, with the approval of the Director SBSSTC, the credits of this subject were considered as 3 for 2015 batch and 4 for the junior batches (**Annexure-5**).

The item is placed before the Academic Council for ratification please.

### Item No. 1. 13: Approval for charges to be levied for various examination related activities and certificates from students of 2021 batch onwards.

The examinations are being conducted for 2021 batch from Nov 2021 session for the students admitted in 2021 batch i.e. the students admitted by SBSSU as its first batch. The complete examination system including the issuing of certificates for 2021 batch onwards is to be handled by SBSSU. A meeting of Registrar, D.R. Accounts, Controller of Examination, Dean Academics and ex-Registrar was held on 13/10/21 to decide the rates of various examination related activities and certificates. In this meeting the rates/ charges to be levied were discussed and the minutes are placed at **Annexure - 6**. The recommended/ proposed charges are mentioned in table below:

#### Item No. 1. 18: Approval of Common Board of Studies of various programs in a department of SBSSU, Ferozepur.

Some of the departments of SBSSU Ferozepur are running many UG and PG programs such as B.Tech Chemical Engg, BSc. Environment, M.Tech Chemical Engg etc. In this regard it is proposed to use the Common Board of Studies (constituted earlier) for all such programs in a department.

# Item No. 1. 19: Approval of Course codes for new Teaching schemes of SBSSU, Ferozepur.

As the University is in the process of developing its own teaching schemes, so, it is proposed that the pattern of course codes for subjects of various teaching schemes of SBSSU should be same as approved vide item no. 6.13 of 6<sup>th</sup> meeting of academic council of SBSSTC Ferozepur. Further, in the new teaching schemes of the university, each subject code has letter "C" placed at the end, for example course code for Engineering Mathematics-I may be BTAM101C. The letters "A" and "B" have already been used for 2015-16 and 2018-19 schemes of SBSSTC Ferozepur.

The matter is placed before the Academic Council for approval please.

#### Item No. 1. 20: Approval to start NCC as General Elective Credit Course.

As per circular No. F. No. AICTE/ PAP/NCC-GE/Circular/2021 dated 26.04.2021 of All India Council For Technical Education (AICTE) to all Directors/Principals of AICTE Approved, it was conveyed that NEP-2020 advocates Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) as integral part of education and it has been felt that NCC should be introduced as general elective credit course in technical institutions/ universities to motivate students to join NCC in order to be disciplined and instil in them the feelings of patriotism. Also Ministry of Education had suggested to take appropriate steps in implementing the aforesaid decision and requested to extend this facility to your students, so that they may opt NCC as General Elective Credit Course from the academic year 2021-2022.

In this regard 13 Pb. Bn. NCC, Ferozepur conducted a conference on NCC as elective subject on 18 June, 2021 in which they discussed and chalk out the modalities and work out a road map for implementation of UGC directions. They also asked our institute to give willingness certificate to introduce NCC as elective subject on credit based system. In this connection, our director submitted that institute will take this matter in our Academic council where decision on it will be taken. He has also given his willingness to introduce NCC as elective subject on credit based system.

Therefore, it is proposed that NCC may be started as General Elective Credit Course from session 2022-23. The detailed circulars, syllabus, scheme is placed as **Annexure – 14**.
